Leave the hustle and bustle of the big city and step into a world where time moves at a different pace. During four hours, discover the archipelago's rich history, from the Ice Age until today, and eat a delicious lunch in a beautiful historic setting.

Your guide will take you on an extended walk across an island still (mostly) void of traffic, with narrow streets and paths, to reach the highest point of Styrösö, where unparalleled views of the harbor and coast of Gothenburg await.

Discover how people have made the island their home for thousands of years, as soon as the retreating ice allowed them to, or what made Styrösö a posh summer retreat for the past 150 years.

King Oscar II was not the only monarch to visit the island. Fairy-tale villas, warm & cold bath houses, stunning hotels, and an enormous restaurant made this a place to be and be seen in the late 19th century. Prohibition and religious fervor changed all of that.



The land rise at the end of the Ice Age gave birth to the island as it rose fifty-seven meters from the sea. Recently, due to climate change, the ocean has begun to reclaim ancient shores.

On Styrösö, people's lives are inextricably linked to the Kattegat, the local sea.

Wander through the forest on Styrösö on your way to our "Viking Cemetery" and meet trees from Alaska, the Alps, the Western United States, and the Balkans! Learn why they grow here among local species, and what happened to the old oaks that once stood here.

Finally, a stroll through the four distinct settlements on Styrösö built by farmers, fishermen, sailors, and summer guests from the mainland.

To top things off, a delicious lunch in the herb garden at Öbergaska, our local café by the harbor. Öbergaska also hosts an art gallery as well as the local heritage museum.

The tour starts & ends at Styrösö Bratten's ferry stop. Reach it by private yacht or public transport from Saltholmen on the mainland.
